

## Registration Forms FAQ

Have you ever registered with this practice before?	Have you used this specific doctor or GP before?
What is my student ID number?	The student ID number is a 7-digit number, usually beginning with 6. You can find this on your student card.
Course title or department:	The name of the degree that you are studying e.g. Psychology, Aerospace Engineering, Economics etc.
Start date of course	What is the day of your first class?
Approximate finish date of course	If you are doing a three year undergraduate degree, full time, this will be approximately June 30 <sup>th</sup> 3 years from now (2023)
Surname	Please enter your last name / surname / family name
First Name	Please enter your first name(s) or given name(s)
Previous Surnames	If you have been married before or have ever had a different surname, please enter it here.
NHS number if known	If you are an international student you WILL NOT have an NHS number. If you are a UK student and you don't know this number, it's important you fill in parts 1 and 2 below.
Town and country of birth	Please write down the town that you were born in and the country that you were born in.
Address FAQs	Where the registration form asks for your home address, this means your university accommodation or the address that you are living at whilst studying at the University of Surrey.
Mobile phone number	If you are an international student, please put your mobile number with the country code.
Email address	This can be any email address that you use – your University of Surrey one or a personal one.
Are you returning from the armed forces?	Have you ever served your country in the army, navy, or air force?
Ethnic origin	Please select which ethnic origin from the list that you identify most closely with. If it is not on the list, you can select other and type in the box.
1 <sup>st</sup> language	What is your preferred spoken language, native language, or mother tongue.
Need interpreter	Will you need someone to help you translate to and from English at the doctors? The practice websites work well with pre-installed translator services that many people whose first language is not English like to use.
Are you a carer?	A carer is anyone, including children and adults, who look after a family member, partner or friend who needs help because of their illness, frailty, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction, and cannot cope without their support. The care they give is unpaid. Action for Carers <a href="https://www.actionforcarers.org.uk/">https://www.actionforcarers.org.uk/</a> can offer support and advice for local carers and signpost as needed.
Do you have a carer?	A carer is anyone, including children and adults who looks after a family member, partner or friend who needs help because of their illness, frailty, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction and cannot cope without their support. The care they give is unpaid.
Serious illness operations or diseases	Please outline in a list any significant medical conditions that you have experienced or have had medical care for.

Previous GP	Please only provide this if you have entered details about serious medical conditions. Please provide contact details and name of your previous GP / doctor / consultant.
Under care of consultant	When was the last time you saw a professional about this serious medical condition.
Tick this box...	If you don't want your doctor while at university to contact your previous doctor, please tick the box.
Please record any disabilities here	A disability means a physical or a mental condition which has a substantial and long-term impact on your ability to do normal day to day activities. Please list any disabilities here.
Special communication needs	If you have a disability or sensory loss, information will be shared with you in a way that you can understand it, for example in large print, braille, via email, or via professional communication support such as a British Sign Language interpreter. If you are still unsure, by selecting yes, it will provide more information and expand on this.
Immunisations	Also known as vaccinations. For international students, it's important that you provide this information. If you are a UK student, who has another UK GP, we are able to access this information through the NHS database. Please still complete if you have this information.
Drug allergies or allergic reactions	Please list any drugs you know you are allergic to, such as penicillin, as well as any other allergies such as nuts. Please also list any allergic reactions you have had in the past.
Current medication	Please list any current medication you are taking. You should be able to find the name, dose and frequency on the prescription you receive from your doctor, or by speaking to your current doctor.
Family history	This includes anything such as heart disease, high blood pressure, mental health difficulties, diabetes, etc.
Emergency contact	This can be anyone of your choosing, parent, family member, or close friend.
Do you smoke	This question refers to smoking of tobacco.
All 3 alcohol questions	The NHS website offers an explanation of what a unit is, and what a 'standard drink' is <a href="#">here</a> .
Cervical smear tests	Cervical smear test if also known as cervical screening or pap smear. Please click <a href="#">here</a> for more information. The following 3 questions are only to be answered by females. If you answer no to the first question, you do not need to answer the following questions.
Summary Care Records	Summary Care Records (SCR) are an electronic record of important patient information, created from GP medical records. They can be seen and used by authorised staff in other areas of the health and care system involved in the patient's direct care. Access to SCR information means that care in other settings is safer, reducing the risk of prescribing errors. It also helps avoid delays to urgent care. Online services application	Although not mandatory, this is the easiest way to contact your doctor should you need an appointment or repeat prescription.
Why do I need to nominate a pharmacy?	Your GP practice uses an <a href="#">electronic prescription system</a> . You need to nominate a pharmacy in order to receive any prescriptions you may be given. You can use this <a href="#">link</a> to find your nearest pharmacy.
